Purbeck Glamping @ Winfrith

We are situated on a working sheep farm Our field is located at the top of the farm's fields; with fine views of the village below and rolling hills.

The 5m bell tents are spacious, elegant, simple and comfortable they do not have power or cooking facilities

We have a large communal fire pit in the centre of the field

The loos and showers are a short walk down the field

Our reception is in a traditional marquee near to the entrance to the carpark of the glamping site, for guests checking in from 3pm and check out by 10am.

You will have access to shared use of a freezer and multiple charge points for USB charging devices or phones (all items left unattended is at their owner risk)

Please enjoy your stay, and look forward to seeing you soon.

Purbeck Glamping: Before you set off; things to think about bringing

Bedding:

Each bell tent has 1 double and 2 single beds.

Set up your beds however you like, just remember to bring fitted sheets, sleeping bags or duvets, and pillows.

Or you can hire bedding packs, which will be located inside your bell tent upon your arrival. Bedding packs include: fitted sheet, duvet, duvet cover, pillow and pillow case

P.s. Don't forget your teddy, as well as a hat and bed socks, as it can get a little chilly at night.

Cooking:

Our bell tents are set up for sleeping and relaxing, cooking is prohibited inside the bell tents.

If you wish to cook on site, please only do it outside the bell tent on raised ground.

We would suggest bringing a small gas camping stove or small barbecue, to be used raised off the ground.

You can hire a fire bowl, which you can toast marshmallows over, or use the communal fire pit to cook over the grill. (But remember to bring all the utensils you require).

You are allowed to bring your own fire pits and wood, (please do not cut any of the trees surrounding the site, there is plenty of wood available for you from the log shed)

Don't forget a camping kettle and cup, if you want to make your own tea or coffee.

There is no Fridge in your bell tent or on site, but you will be able to buy milk on site, as well as a fresh coffee, smoothies and juices from the pop-up coffee van that arrives each morning to cater for your needs.

Pop-up food vendors will also be visiting the site, information will be provided at the reception tent.

Keeping things/food cool: Remember to bring your own cool box and ice packs. You are welcome to refreeze your ice packs in our communal freezer.

Cooking Utensils: Bring all the cups, crockery and cutlery you think you may need. Don't forget a bottle opener and camping stove. Try to avoid bringing glass items that could break.

Simple wash up station: we have open air sinks with washing up liquid. You may need a bowl and tea towel and cloth/sponge

Basic supplies to bring: hand sanitiser, loo roll, biodegradable wet wipes, face coverings, any medication you need (pain killers, antihistamine), bin bags. Towels and pegs to hang them on your guy ropes to dry. Camping chairs, picnic rugs, milk, tea, coffee, a bottle of wine, some beers, snacks and don't forget the marshmallows.

Toiletries: Don't forget your toothbrush, toothpaste, shower gel etc.

Charging Facilities: Remember to bring your power bank for your phone. We have limited charging facilities in reception and cannot guarantee that we will be able to charge your phone each day.

Lighting: Bring torches (or even better head torches) as it gets pretty dark out here. Walking through the lanes at night is dark and getting about on the campsite is easier with a torch after dark.

Clothing: Warm clothes. Even if it is 25 degrees during the day the temperature can drop at night and you are just under canvas so make sure you have some layers to keep you warm.

Other information to be aware of:

Babies and very small children - if your child needs to sleep in a cot, you will need to bring a travel cot. We do not offer the facilities for babies and very small children.

Mobility challenges - the site is part of a working small farm and we are set up on a slightly sloping top field. The ground is uneven and grassed - the loos and showers are 100m walk.

- You cannot park right next to your tent.
- There are steps up to the toilets and shower doors.
- The site will be dark at night with minimal lighting from reception to the centre of the field and small solar lighting around each bell tent.

Remember Covid19 Rules and do not travel to us if required to self-isolate to prevent the spread to others. Ensure that you have holiday insurance against any losses you may incur.

Arriving at Purbeck Glamping:

Directions:

- Drive right through the village of Winfrith Newburgh
- At the Church turn right (along East Chaldon Lane)
- Lookout for the sign on your right (about 100m up East Chaldon Lane from the Church) for the lane up to Fives Farm
- Proceed very slowly up the lane as you meet farm traffic, riders, walkers or other guests and it is gravel and narrow
- At the top of the lane take the left lane and go through the gate to Fives Farm
- Follow the signposts for Purbeck Glamping up the drive and past the barn, to the top field

You will then arrive at Purbeck Glamping field. The car park will be in front of you, please drive in and park to the right. (Carpark clearly signposted)

Check In from 15:00 (3pm) - NO EARLIER

You will be given a bell tent number and map to show its position on site.

There is no driving over the field, so please walk to your bell tent.

Please use the wheelbarrow at reception to transport your items.

Please return the wheelbarrows to reception once you have finished for other guests to use.

If you have booked and paid for bedding and/ or a fire pit will be already with your bell tent.

Check Out no later than 10:00am

Please ensure you inform the site manager that you have vacated your bell tent.

- Please leave your bell tent tidy, clean and as you found it.
- Please remember all your belongings.
- Please bag up all you waste and recycling and drop it into the correct bin.

• If you have hired bedding please strip the bedding, pop it in the clear bag and leave in your bell tent.

• If you hired a fire bowl, please empty any ashes (once cold) into the correct bin and leave your fire pit outside reception. #

• Don't forget your ice blocks and phone charger if you left them at reception.

Onsite Showers and Toilets

Showers will be closed for deep cleaning after check out time is complete. Please ensure you report any issues with the showers to the site manager.

Toilets are open 24/7, however these facilities do require emptying and will be closed for short periods of time throughout the week. Alternative toilets will be made available during this time.
